This report presents Ulysseus' progress in establishing its first international branch, focusing on the strategic partnership with the University of Da Nang (UD) in Vietnam. The deliverable aims to serve as a guide for good practices in research and innovation (R&I) internationalization, drawing on insights from the D7.2 Impact Report

It outlines key milestones, collaborative initiatives, and recommendations for future partnerships while emphasizing the importance of a clear international cooperation strategy.

This document reviews the progress made by Ulysseus towards its internationalization goals, specifically through the establishment of partnerships outside the European Union. It highlights the strategic significance of the partnership with UD and provides an overview of actions taken to promote good practices in R&I internationalization.

1.1 ULYSSEUS: A LEADING EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY ALLIANCE

<u>Ulysseus European University</u> (Ulysseus) is one of the 24 selected alliances from the second pilot call for proposals under the 2020 Erasmus+ work programme. Initially established with six universities, it has since expanded to include eight diverse institutions:

University of Münster (UM), Germany University of Montenegro (UoM), Montenegro





This unique blend of comprehensive universities (USE, UniCa; UniGe, WWU, UoM), a technical university (TUKE) and universities of Applied Sciences (MCI, Haaga-Helia) fosters a dynamic learning environment encompassing all four European regions (according to the categories set by EUROVOC). From the oldest to the youngest, from comprehensive to specialized business and technical Universities, from established, research-based Universities, to experts in entrepreneurship and academic innovation, sharing common objectives and long-lasting successful cooperation for boosting the four missions of the Higher Education institutions: education research, innovation and service to society."¹







1.2 COMPASS: FLAGSHIP OF ULYSSEUS R&I AGENDA & STRATEGY

COMPASS serves as the flagship initiative for Ulysseus' Research and Innovation (R&I) agenda and strategy. Its core objective is to solidify Ulysseus' long-term vision as a model of excellence for R&I by strengthening synergies between the European Research Area (ERA) and the European Education Area.

Key Objectives:

- Placing Ulysseus' Innovation Hubs at the forefront of European research policy.
- Fostering activities that generate impactful research and innovation outcomes.
- Propelling Ulysseus towards becoming a leading European university model in Open Science, Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI), and internationalization.

1.3 BEYOND EUROPE: EXPANDING ULYSSEUS' REACH

WP7 of COMPASS, aptly named "Compass Beyond Europe," spearheads Ulysseus' endeavors to promote its R&I agenda globally.

This aligns perfectly with the European Union's (EU) strategy for fostering international research and innovation cooperation. WP7 endeavours to transform Ulysseus in an international R&I European University model, particularly in identified geographical areas of

Goals:

Transform Ulysseus into a leading international R&I European University model.

Establish strong R&I collaborations in geographically targeted areas.

- Facilitating student/staff mobility through Erasmus+
- Strengthening research and innovation cooperation with partner countries.

2.1 Ulysseus: A Global Network for Research and Innovation

Ulysseus' strategic internationalization approach centers on building a robust global network for Research and Innovation (R&I). The establishment of international branches is a pivotal step towards achieving this goal, fostering collaborative research, educational opportunities, and innovation on a wider scale.







2.1.1 Establishing International Branches

2.1.1.1 Ulysseus Internationalisation Roadmap

Ulysseus' internationalization roadmap outlines a strategic approach for establishing international branches, guiding the alliance's efforts to expand its global reach and impact. Key components include:

Key Milestones:

- Identification of Target Regions: Ulysseus conducted a thorough assessment of potential regions based on existing research strengths, alignment with EU priorities, and funding opportunities.
- **Feasibility Studies**: Detailed evaluations assess the viability of establishing branches, considering market demand, institutional capacity, and regulatory requirements.
- **Partnership Development**: The roadmap prioritized the development of strategic partnerships with local universities or institutions to facilitate the establishment of branches.

Strategies:

- Leveraging Existing Partnerships: Ulysseus leveraged existing partnerships and networks to identify potential opportunities for branch establishment.
- Alignment with EU Priorities: The roadmap ensured that branch locations and initiatives aligned with the EU's international cooperation strategy and the Global Gateway initiative.
- Funding and Resource Allocation: Ulysseus developed a comprehensive plan for securing funding and allocating resources to support the establishment and operation of international branches.

2.1.1.2 Branch Selection Criteria

Ulysseus employs a set of criteria for selecting suitable locations for international branches, including:

- Alignment with Ulysseus' Strategic Goals: Potential locations were evaluated based on their alignment with Ulysseus' overall mission and strategic objectives.
- Research Excellence: Regions with strong research capabilities and expertise in areas that complement Ulysseus' strengths were prioritized.
- Educational Opportunities: Locations with a vibrant higher education landscape and potential for student and faculty exchange were considered.
- Economic and Political Stability: Regions with a stable economic and political environment were preferred to ensure the long-term sustainability of branches.
- **Regulatory Framework:** Compliance with local regulations and a favorable regulatory environment were essential factors.

2.1.1.3 Strategic Partnerships

The establishment of international branches is closely linked to strategic partnerships with local universities or institutions. Ulysseus sought partners that:

- Share Ulysseus' values and vision.
- Have complementary research strengths and expertise.
- Are committed to fostering collaborative research and education initiatives.
- Can provide local support and resources for branch establishment and operation





2.1.2 Fostering Global Research Collaborations

2.1.2.1 Partnership Selection Criteria

When selecting partners for global research collaborations, Ulysseus considers the following criteria:

- Research Complementarity: Partners should have complementary research interests and expertise to facilitate collaborative projects.
- Shared Values: Partners should share Ulysseus' values and commitment to excellence in research and innovation.
- Geographic Diversity: Collaborations with partners from diverse geographical regions can enhance Ulysseus' global reach and impact.

2.1.2.2 Collaborative Research Projects

Ulysseus has initiated numerous collaborative research projects with international partners, covering a wide range of topics. These projects aim to address global challenges, advance knowledge, and foster innovation.

Examples of Collaborations:

- GreenH4S Smart Greenhouse Project: A joint research project with international partners focused on developing sustainable agriculture solutions.
- Al in Language Learning and Environmental Sustainability
 Studies: Collaborative research exploring the application of
 Al in language learning and environmental sustainability.
- Capacity Building in Higher Education Projects:
 Collaborative projects aimed at enhancing educational practices and promoting capacity development in partner institutions.





2.1.2.3 Knowledge Exchange Initiatives

Ulysseus fosters knowledge exchange through various initiatives, including:

2.1.3 Case Studies in Action

Ulysseus' internationalization strategy is exemplified by its partnerships with key institutions that align with its mission of fostering global research and innovation. Notable collaborations with the University of Montenegro, the University of Da Nang (UD), and Laval University highlight the practical application of Ulysseus' strategic efforts to expand its reach and influence.

2.1.3.1 The University of Montenegro: A Significant Step Towards Global Expansion

The University of Montenegro (UCG) officially became a full member of Ulysseus in November 2023, marking a pivotal moment in the alliance's internationalization journey. It is the largest and only public university in Montenegro, known for its strong academic and research tradition, making it an ideal partner in Ulysseus' quest for global expansion.







2.1.3 Case Studies in Action

Key highlights of UCG include:

- Largest Public University in Montenegro: UCG holds a central position in the Montenegrin higher education landscape, providing comprehensive educational and research opportunities.
- Commitment to Internationalization: UCG is dedicated to enhancing its position within the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) and the European Research Area (ERA), fully aligning with Ulysseus' mission of global collaboration.
- Alignment with Ulysseus' Values: UCG's mission, grounded in fostering research, education, and societal impact, mirrors Ulysseus' own strategic objectives, paving the way for a productive partr

The establishment of the **Cybersecurity Innovation Hub** at UCG marked the **first Ulysseus branch outside Europe**. This pioneering initiative solidifies Ulysseus' commitment to international growth and fostering a global Research and Innovation (R&I) network. The hub, which leverages UCG's expertise in cybersecurity research, is positioned to address critical cybersecurity challenges and foster innovative solutions. It serves as a model for future Ulysseus branches, advancing cross-border collaboration in education and R&I...

2.1.4 Case Studies Strategic Partnerships: Expanding Global Reach

Building on Ulysseus' commitment to fostering strategic partnerships, the university has engaged in notable collaborations that exemplify the expansion of its international footprint. Two key partnerships illustrate Ulysseus' approach to global collaboration:

University of Da Nang (UD), Vietnam:



In June 2023, Ulysseus signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the University of Da Nang (UD), Vietnam. This MoU established a collaborative framework in R&I and set the stage for the creation of the first Ulysseus branch outside of Europe. By leveraging UD's strengths in areas such as cybersecurity, this partnership aims to promote knowledge exchange and collaborative research.







2.1.3 Case Studies in Action

Laval University, Canada:

Similarly, in June 2023, Ulysseus entered into an MoU with Laval University, Canada, focusing on collaboration in education, research, and knowledge exchange. This partnership serves as a model for future international integration, as both institutions work toward joint research projects and academic exchanges.



These partnerships underscore Ulysseus' ability to align with global institutions that share its vision for innovation and excellence. Through these strategic collaborations, Ulysseus aims to extend its reach, contribute to global solutions, and enhance its role as a leader in international research and innovation.

3.1 Meetings And Research Collaboration

The Ulysseus-Da Nang partnership was developed through a series of four key meetings that established the foundation for collaboration. These meetings explored synergies, identified joint research projects, and discussed faculty and student exchanges

Here is a breakdown of the four meetings and the research topics discussed:

MEETING #1



ULYSSEUS – DA NANG INTRODUCTORY (FEBRUARY 2023)

This meeting focused on identifying existing agreements and synergies between Ulysseus partners and the University of Da Nang (UD), particularly its Da Nang International Institute of Technology (DNIIT). Discussions explored potential collaborations in areas that could benefit from combined expertise.

MEETING #2



ULYSSEUS – DA NANG BILATERAL (APRIL 2023)

These in-depth discussions revolved around Ulysseus Innovation Hub topics and aimed to identify joint research projects between Ulysseus partners and Da Nang counterparts. Specific research areas included: Sustainable energy, Smart city development; Management (including micromanagement and marketing for hospitality and tourism); Social science (focusing on social and technical training of teachers within Al models and exploring the impact of Al on future training)





3.1 Meetings And Research Collaboration

MEETING #3



ULYSSEUS SUMMIT MEETING IN NICE, FRANCE (MARCH 2023)

During the March summit in Nice (21-22 March), the Compass workgroup focused on Innovation Hubs, laying the groundwork for future collaborations.

MEETING #4



MOU SIGNING MEETING IN NICE, FRANCE (JUNE 2023)

At this meeting, Ulysseus advanced its internationalization strategy by signing Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with the University of Da Nang (Vietnam) and Laval University (Canada). These agreements provide a framework for collaboration in education, research, and knowledge exchange, including the creation of research hubs in Da Nang and Laval.

The agreements establish joint initiatives and projects in research, academic exchanges, conferences, workshops and training programmes, aimed at achieving common goals. By outlining areas of collaboration, the MoUs foster coordination and joint efforts to address shared challenges and pursue mutual interests.





3.1 Meetings And Research Collaboration MEETING #5

This significant event marked a crucial step towards establishing the first Ulysseus Strategic Partnership "Beyond Europe" in Da Nang. The draft MoU with the University of Da Nang laid the groundwork for this expansion







3.2 MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)





2023, stands as a landmark achievement in the Ulysseus-Da Nang partnership. Here's a closer look:

- Purpose: This MoU establishes a framework for cooperative relations in the fields of education, research, and other related activities between Ulysseus and the University of Da Nang.
- Significance: This signed agreement represents a formal commitment from both parties to collaborate and foster joint endeavors in education and research. It paves the way for the creation of the first Ulysseus branch outside Europe.
- **Additional Considerations:** The signing ceremony involved representatives from current Ulvsseus member universities, new members for the next Erasmus+ call (University of Münster and University of Montenegro), and the University of Da Nang.

This highlights the potential for the MoU to serve as a springboard for further international partnerships.





3.3 ULYSSEUS-DA NANG EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND INNOVATION FORUM (UDERIF)

This subsection provides insights into the UDERIF forum, emphasizing its role in solidifying international collaboration and promoting collaborative efforts in education and research.

The UDERIF forum held in October 2023 served as a pivotal platform for solidifying the international collaboration between Ulysseus and the University of Da Nang. It comprised the Ulysseus/Da Nang Workshop and the Governing Council meeting. Let's delve deeper:

OBJECTIVES:

The primary objective of the workshop was to identify tangible project opportunities based on the synergies and common interests explored in previous meetings.

The Governing Council meeting aimed to formalize an agreement between Ulysseus and the University of Da Nang, laying the foundation for establishing the inaugural Ulysseus Hub/Branch.

The event structure included plenary talks, technical sessions, and demonstrations to facilitate collaboration.

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION:

Over 100 delegates participated, with more than 80 representatives from Ulysseus showcasing their expertise alongside colleagues from the University of Da Nang. This forum actively promoted collaborative efforts in education and research, contributing to a stronger international partnership.





3.3 ULYSSEUS-DA NANG EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND INNOVATION FORUM (UDERIF)

RESEARCH WORKSHOPS:

Seven workshops engaged over 90 researchers, addressing key global challenges and hot topics in education, including:

- Smart Education (AI in Education and Green Cities)
- Higher Education Internationalization and Sustainable University
- Innovation and Entrepreneurship
- Sustainable Tourism and Digital Economy
- Culture, Art, and Heritage
- Sustainable Energy, Robotics, and Environment
- Data Science

These workshops aimed to boost strategic collaboration beyond the alliance, positioning Ulysseus as a model for European University excellence in Research and Innovation on a global scale.







3.3 ULYSSEUS-DA NANG EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND INNOVATION FORUM (UDERIF)

3.3.1 Collaborative Initiatives Resulting from UDERIF Conference

The collaborative initiatives highlighted in this section signify the tangible outcomes of the UDERIF conference, a pivotal platform that solidified the international collaboration between Ulysseus and the University of Da Nang (UD). These initiatives reflect the shared commitment of both institutions to foster innovation and facilitate knowledge exchange across various domains of Education, Research, and Innovation (ERI).

COLLABORATIVE PROJECTS:

Capacity Building in Higher Education (CBHE) Projects: Teams from diverse institutions have joined forces to collaborate on CBHE projects, focusing on cutting-edge areas such as Smart Education, renewable energy, mobility, robotics, and the intersection of law and technology. These collaborative efforts aim to enhance educational practices, drive technological advancements, and address pressing societal challenges.

Joint Teaching Endeavors: The collaborative spirit extends to teaching activities, with joint efforts encompassing the development and delivery of virtual courses in Culture, Tourism, and Language Education. Additionally, collaborative Master's programs have been established, providing students with enriched learning experiences and opportunities for cross-cultural exchange.

Research Collaborations: The UDERIF conference has facilitated robust research collaborations, including virtual conferences, monthly seminars, and capacity-building activities. These initiatives foster interdisciplinary dialogue, facilitate knowledge dissemination, and contribute to the advancement of cuttingedge research in diverse fields.





3.3 ULYSSEUS-DA NANG EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND INNOVATION FORUM (UDERIF)

Support for International Publications: Recognizing the importance of scholarly dissemination, Ulysseus and UD have extended support for international publications, enabling researchers to share their findings with a global audience. This support enhances the visibility and impact of research outcomes, fostering collaboration and promoting academic excellence.

ADDITIONAL INSIGHTS:

Proposed Projects: Noteworthy projects proposed during the conference include on-site studies on Vietnamese artistic heritage, aimed at understanding its historical significance and preservation challenges. Additionally, training activities have been proposed to address research challenges faced by Vietnamese universities, emphasizing capacity building and knowledge transfer.

Involvement of DNIIT: The Danang National Institute of Information Technology (DNIIT) has played a crucial role in coordinating collaborative efforts, further solidifying the partnership between Ulysseus and UD. DNIIT's involvement underscores the collective commitment to advancing educational and research endeavors in the region.


KEY POINTS:
